THERE WAS WIDESPREAD ANGER AND DISAPPOINTMENT among many of Northern California's birders when news broke last summer about a very rare Crested Caracara in southwest Sonoma County which had not been reported to the general birding public. As a result of the uproar, RROS President Ian Morrison met with Betty Burridge and Ruth Rudesill to discuss RROS policy regarding rare bird sightings in order to best serve the Northern California birding community.

As a brief background, the caracara was first found on private property. The owners did not wish to be disturbed so the decision not to publicize the bird's presence and location was made. A few days later the bird could be seen from a nearby public road. Betty solicited and compiled comments from NorthBayBirders Yahoo Group members and concluded that most felt that the bird should have been immediately reported in any case.

At the RROS meeting called by Ian it was decided that when a rare bird is sighted, its presence, location, and the status of its location (private or public property) should be immediately announced via the RROS phone wheel, North.Cal. Bird Box, NorthBayBirds Yahoo Group, and to CalBirds if warranted. If the bird is on private property, the finder of the bird should first make every effort to discuss all limitations or rules the owner wishes to set for viewing of the bird by the birding public, and these rules should be made clear in communications regarding the sighting. If permission to enter the property is not granted, it is expected that birders will respect the ABA Code of Ethics and not trespass. For RROS members who do not have access to email there will again be a phone wheel. All others will have access to NorthBayBirds. \*(See below.) Two members, (continued on page 6)

The bird sighting must also be reported to NorthBayBirds and the Bird Box. This way all will have an equal chance of getting the word on a rare bird.
