FIELD TRIPS:

April 30, Saturday 7:30/9:00 a.m. – Field Trip to Mitchell Canyon, Contra Costa County

This beautiful canyon on the slopes of Mt. Diablo is a great place to observe newly arrived spring migrants. It's a magnet for less common migrating birds such as Hammond's Flycatcher, Calliope Hummingbird, Nashville and Hermit Warbler. Along with the birds come a nice variety of butterflies and wildflowers. Meet at 7:30 a.m. at the Petaluma Park-and-Ride (on Lakeville Hwy in Petaluma just west of US101) for carpooling or meet at the Mitchell Canyon parking lot at 9:00 a.m. To get to Mitchell Canyon, go south on I-680 from the Martinez Bridge and take the Treat Blvd. Exit north of Walnut Creek. Turn left (south) at the first light and proceed a short distance to Treat Blvd. Turn left (east) on Treat Blvd. Drive 1.1 miles to Bancroft Rd. and turn right. Drive 0.6 mile to Ygnacio Valley Rd. and turn left. Travel 5.1 miles to Clayton Rd. and turn right. Drive one mile and turn right onto Mitchell Canyon Rd. Proceed 1.6 miles to the end. Bring binoculars, hiking shoes, water, and lunch. We will walk about 3 miles at a leisurely pace and eat on the trail. Call leader Alan Wight (weekdays 7-9 pm or week-ends any time) at 763-8572 if you plan to meet the group at Mitchell Canyon or if you have any questions.

Saturday, May 21, 8:00 a.m. - Field Trip to Pine Flat Road

We'll search for chaparral, grassland, and woodland birds along the length of Pine Flat Road in the wake of the 2004 fire. Meet at the first bridge on Pine Flat Road at 8:00 am. WEST NILE WARNING:

According to information gathered by and reported in Santa Rosa's <u>PRESS</u> <u>DEMOCRAT</u> on March 26th, there have already been 21 dead birds suspected of having the West Nile Virus reported in Sonoma County this year. July 26th was the earliest date that a West Nile virus bird was reported in 2004, and it was Sonoma County's first. Elsewhere, the second year of West Nile infestation is usually worse than the first. 2005 will be Sonoma Co.'s second year.


The general public is encouraged to remove all sources of standing water to prevent mosquito infestations. Individuals are encouraged to protect themselves by using DEET based insect repellant and covering up, especially at dawn and dusk. Fortunately, only 1 in 150 people bitten by a carrier may develop a severe illness. However, we should all be aware that there is no cure for this potentially fatal disease, and there is not yet a vaccine to protect humans
