FIELD TRIP: April 29, Sun. Field trip to Mitchell Canyon.

This beautiful canyon on the slopes of Mt. Diablo is a great place to observe newly arrived spring migrants. It's a magnet for less common migrating birds such as Hammond's Flycatcher, Calliope Hummingbird, Nashville Warbler, and Hermit Warbler. Along with the birds come a nice variety of butterflies and wildflowers.

Meet at 7:30 a.m. at the Petaluma Park-and-Ride for carpooling or meet at the Mitchell Canyon parking lot at 9:00 a.m. The Petaluma Park-and-Ride is located on Lakeville Highway in Petaluma just west of US101. To get to Mitchell Canyon, go south on I-680 from the Martinez Bridge and take the Treat Boulevard exit north of Walnut Creek. Turn left (south) at the first light and proceed a short distance to Treat Boulevard. Turn left (east) on Treat Boulevard. Drive 1.1 miles to Bancroft Road and turn right. Drive 0.6 mile to Ignacio Valley Road and turn left. Travel 5.1 miles to Clayton Road and turn right. Drive one mile and turn right onto Mitchell Canyon Road. Follow this road for 1.6 miles to the end. Bring binoculars, hiking shoes, water, and a lunch. We will walk about three miles at a leisurely pace and eat lunch on the trail. FIELD TRIP REPORT

King Ridge Road Field Trip, March 11, 2007 - by Lisa Hug

About 25 RROS members gathered in Duncan's Mills on a Sunday morning to explore King Ridge Road. We started the excursion by visiting 2 different bakeries and then proceeded up the road. The weather was beautifully warm and sunny! Our birding highlights included fantastic views of the American Dipper feeding, flying and, of course, dipping. We also heard Sooty Grouse booming, and later found a couple of Red-breasted Sapsuckers that we watched for quite some time.

Species seen: Wood Duck, Turkey Vulture, Red-shouldered hawk, Red-tailed Hawk, Anna's Hummingbird, Red-breasted Sapsucker, Black Phoebe, Tree Swallow, Violet-green Swallow, Cliff Swallow, Steller's Jay, Western Scrub-Jay, Common Raven, Chestnut-backed Chickadee, Bushtit, Brown Creeper, Bewick's Wren, Winter Wren, Golden-crowned Kinglet, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, Western Bluebird, Hermit Thrush, American Robin, Varied Thrush, Cedar Waxwing, European Starling, Hutton's Vireo, Spotted Towhee, California Towhee, Dark-eyed Junco, Red-winged Blackbird, Brewer's Blackbird, House Finch, American Dipper, Sooty Grouse, and Wild Turkey.
