### FIELD TRIP REPORT - Outer Pt. Reyes, Sept. 22 - Ruth Rudesill

Twenty two participants braved rain and wind at the until it cleared and were rewarded with great looks at a Townsend's Solitaire, tan striped White -throated Sparrow, and two spectacular Peregrine Falcons that soared and dove around the Lighthouse

At the Fish Docks - there was a flock of sparrows with a Clay-colored Sparrow and later two probable Brewer's Sparrows were observed. Two Eurasian Collared Doves were a county bird for most. And Willow Flycatcher.

Nunes and Mendoza had more western migrants (yellow warblers, western tanager, western pacific-sloped flycatchers)

At Drakes Beach there was a Laughing Gull in rather poor condition in the parking lot. Also Nashville Warbler and Warbling Vireo.

We had a great time despite the lack of eastern vagrants!
