## FIELD TRIP REPORT Feb 16, 0'08 - Davis Area & Wetlands

Our trip to Vic Fazio Wildlife Refuge was redirected to the Davis Wetlands & Sewer Ponds, due to high water on the Refuge. Nonetheless, we had a great turn out, 20 birders, and a total of 75 species. Highlights included: Yellow-headed Blackbird, Cliff Swallows, American Bittern, five blue phase Snow Geese, Rough-legged Hawk, Thayer's Gull and a day roost of 150+ Black-crowned Night Herons as reported by Rick Le Baudour (leader.)
