FIELD TRIP REPORTS

Anza Borrego State Park and environs - March 27 - 30, 2008

Six RROS members took three vehicles to converge on Anza Borrego State Park. Leader Peter Colasanti and Don Howard previewed from Needles down the Colorado River to the park via Salton Sea, returning via Tijuana Valley NWR. Rick Lebaudour and Richard Merris birded Morongo Valley en route; Karen Nagel and Shirley Spina planned to hit Morongo on the return.

First day highlights included a flock of Greater White-fronted Geese over waterless desert at Carrizo Creek, three species of orioles, Lincoln's Sparrow and multiple Common Yellowthroats in spare mesquite at Agua Caliente County Park.

Day two we ascended Montezuma Grade, birding down to Tamarisk Campground via San Felipe Grade. Desert specialties were White-winged & Common Ground-Doves, Cactus & Rock Wrens, Brewer's, Vesper & Black-throated Sparrows, and Ladder-backed Woodpeckers with Nuttall's higher up. Early migrant Bell's and Cassin's Vireos and Black-throated Gray Warbler were found too, as were all three Goldfinches.

Rick Lebaudour led day three to the Salton Sea, starting at Cattle Call Park in Brawley, which yielded Gila Woodpecker, Gray Vireo, Lucy's Warbler and Abert's Towhee. Later stops were at "Lack Lindsay", Sonny Bono NWR, Red Hill Marina, and anyplace we couldn't bear to drive by. Lesser Scaup, Redhead, Gull-billed Tern and Yellow-footed Gull were working the open water and thirteen species of shorebird probed the flats.

Day four opened with a search for LeConte's Thrasher at Clark Dry Lake. Instead we found a flock of 6 Sage Thrashers. We all got looks at a Roadrunner playing chicken with Rick's rig, and even better looks when we stopped and it responded to playback. The best of the day was a 4WD stream-fording ascent to the Lower Willows of Coyote Cañon. About halfway we all stopped for a Lark Sparrow and simultaneously pulled out our cameras; the floral display was too good to pass by. Up at the willows we picked up a Virginia Rail, lots of Costa's and a nice Rufous Hummer, and also many neotropical passerines, including a Black-headed Grosbeak.

Swainson's Hawks were migrating through. It seems that they lollygag between Borrego Springs and the airport to eat the big yellow Sphinx Moth caterpillars all over the sandy soil. We saw as many as 50 at one time and it was a revelation to realize how many dark morph Swainson's head north from there.

All in all, 148 species were observed over the four days of the tour and at least 188 overall, including the trips down and back to the Birdiest County in the Union.


