FIELD TRIPS

Wednesday, Sept. 10th – Vaux's Swifts 6:30 p.m. Rio Lindo Academy Healdsburg – Leader is Peter Leveque <u>Directions</u>: Heading north on Hwy101, take the Old Redwood Hwy/Healdsburg Avenue exit. Go north to Bailhache Ave., turn right and continue for about 3 miles to the entrance of Rio Lindo Academy. Turn left at first stop sign, then left again just before the dormitory. Go ½ block to the rear of the campus. The chimney is on a side street west of the athletic field.

Saturday, **Sept. 20th** – **Field Trip to outer Point Reyes.** Meet at 7:15 AM at the Petaluma Park and Ride (west of Hwy 101 at junction with Hwy 116) OR 8:00 AM at Whitehouse Pool (from Pt. Reyes Station go south and cross a bridge, then immediately make a sharp right onto Sir Francis Drake Rd. Just before reaching Bear Valley Road (3/4 mile) turn right into Whitehouse Pool parking lot). Bring lunch, layer clothes, and optics. We plan on heading out to the Lighthouse first but we may stop if a good bird is at one of the ranches. Leader is Ruth Rudesill.
