General Meeting, Thursday, April 9, 7:00 pm Speaker: Keith Hanson

Keith Hansen is a wildlife artist who specializes in the accurate and imaginative illustration of birds. Having a gallery and studio in Bolinas, Keith enjoys creating in an area with such a wealth of feathered subjects. He is currently illustrating a book entitled, "A Field Guide to the Birds of the Sierra Nevada and Mono Lake." This guide will depict each of the 320 species of birds that occur annually in the Sierra. The 68 watercolor plates will portray birds in various plumages, pointing out differences in sex, age, season and the like. Keith will bring some of the original plates from the book, and will share with us stories, techniques and the ins and outs of doing a field guide.

<u>Directions to the meetings:</u> From Hwy 101 take Hwy 116 West toward Sebastopol. Turn right (north) on Llano Rd. and go ~ 1 mile to **Laguna Wastewater**Treatment Plant at 4300 Llano Rd, Santa Rosa. Look for an open gate on right. Proceed to Administration Bldg. at SE corner of the plant. From Hwy. 12, take Llano Rd. south about 3 miles.

FIELD TRIPS

Saturday, April 18- Field Trip to Mitchell Canyon

Mitchell Canyon is a great spring birding spot on the north flanks of Mt Diablo. Hope for birds include Hammond's Flycatcher, Calliope Hummingbird, Hermit Warbler and Nashville Warbler. The wildflowers and butterflies should be beautiful. Meet 7am Petaluma park'n'ride at Lakeville Hwy and Hwy 101 for carpooling. Or meet 8am at the Mitchell Canyon Parking Area which is located on Mitchell Canyon Road from Clayton Road northeast of Walnut Creek. Bring binoculars, sunscreen, water, food for lunch, hats. Saturday, May 16-Field Trip to Pine Flat Road


