SEPT.10 - THURS. Tour/Birding/Potluck/Meeting

What happens to polluted water coming from household toilets, sinks and showers or from business and industry? Here is your chance to find out. On Thursday, September 10 at <u>5:30 p.m.</u>, Denise Cadwell, Natural Resources Specialist for the City of Santa Rosa, will give a tour of the Laguna Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The Laguna Treatment Plant, serving Santa Rosa, Rohnert Park, Cotati and Sebastopol, treats an average of 18 million gallons of sewage a day. Sewage reaches the Llano Road facility through 500 miles of pipe carrying polluted water away from homes and businesses.

Sewage receives a three step treatment followed by disinfection, using ultraviolet light. After treatment, water is recycled back to the environment by geysers recharge, summer irrigation, and, in wet years, winter discharge. Solids are used as fertilizers or composted. The program involves many elements of testing and reporting to ensure public health and environmental safety.

All this water and sewage are an irresistible lure to birds and other wildlife, as you will see during the tour of the plant's adjacent wetlands. Be sure to bring binoculars.

At <u>7:00 p.m.</u>, following the tour, we shall have a potluck dinner in the conference room. The City of Santa Rosa does not allow alcohol on the premises.

Bring salad/main dish/side dish/dessert/hors d'oeuvres or whatever, as well as table settings, beverages, and binoculars.

<u>Directions to the meetings:</u> From Hwy 101 take Hwy 116 West toward Sebastopol. Turn right (north) on Llano Rd. and go ~ 1 mile to Laguna Wastewater Treatment Plant at 4300 Llano Rd, Santa Rosa. Look for an open gate on right. Proceed to Administration Bldg. at SE corner of the plant. From Hwy. 12, take Llano Rd. south about 3 miles.

FIELD TRIP REPORT

Pine Flat Road May 16, 2009

The Pine flat Road field trip was a great success – in spite of the heat. We started the day by driving straight up to the top of the road. We spent a good part of the morning searching the chaparral habitat for birds. We drifted down the hill and made several stops. We ended the trip around 2:00. Bird highlights include Hermit Warbler, Townsend's Warbler, California Thrasher, Rufous-crowned Sparrow, Indigo Bunting (seen by a few observers) and Mountain Quails were heard frequently. We saw 53 species of birds cumulatively, including:

Warbling Vireo, Steller's Jay, Western Scrub-Jay, Common Raven, Purple Martin, Violet-green Swallow, Oak Titmouse, Bushtit, Red-breasted Nuthatch, Bewick's Wren, House Wren, Blue-gray Gnatcatcher, Western Bluebird, American Robin, Wrentit, California Thrasher, Orange-crowned Warbler, Yellow Warbler, Black-throated Gray Warbler, Townsend's Warbler, Hermit Warbler, Wilson's Warbler, Western Tanager, Spotted Towhee, California Towhee, Song Sparrow, Dark-eyed Junco, Blackheaded Grosbeak, Indigo Bunting, Lazuli Bunting, Western Meadowlark, Bullock's Oriole, Lesser Goldfinch.

LUKE COLE 400 SPECIES \$40,000 MEMORIAL CHALLENGE

As many of you already heard, the birding community and world lost one of its most selfless supporters on June 6, 2009. Luke Cole was killed in a car accident while birding in Uganda. Luke was a San Francisco based humanitarian and environmental attorney. He had not only had served on the California Rare Birds Committee and was a Regional Editor for "North American Birds" for ABA, avid county lister, working breeding bird atlases and surveys; he was top environmental lawyer that gave up a highly paid career to help people, communities and the environment in need. He was also great guy!

To celebrate Luke's life, some of his friends came up with a fun challenge to keep his Center on Race, Poverty, and the Environment (CRPE) running strong. The challenge is on the weekend of September 26 and 27th, can a group of birders find 400 species in California? And raise \$40,000 while doing it? Everyone can participate by sending in bird sightings and donating money to the cause.

I know a lot of folks will want to be at outer Pt. Reyes that weekend but keep track of those Sonoma County birds while enroute. I hope some will volunteer to go to Bodega Bay, Shollenberger, and in the hills for a few hours. Even feeder watchers can help. I plan to try owling and I'm hoping that the Yellow-billed Loon will stick around. Other birds that may help the list are Common Black Hawk, Black Rail, and the Ross's Goose at Lucchesi Park. How many species can we see in Sonoma County that weekend?

We are asking for donations, a lump sum or \$ per species seen in Sonoma County. We will discuss this at the meeting. If you have any questions, or want to actively participate, contact me. I will be getting more details soon.
