WESTERN AND CLARK'S GREBES by Diana L. Humple, Sonoma State University and PRBO Conservation Science

The Western Grebe and its sister species, the Clark's Grebe, are highly vulnerable to oil spills in their nonbreeding nearshore habitat along the Pacific coast. In fact, they are among the most commonly oiled species during coastal California spills. In order to increase our understanding of the demographic impacts of oil spills on grebes, my master's research focused on grebe population structure, migratory connectivity, and age and sex ratios of grebes killed in three marine events. These questions were explored using genetics, bird banding and recovery data, and necropsies.

<u>Directions to the meetings:</u> From Hwy 101 take Hwy 116 West toward Sebastopol. Turn right (north) on Llano Rd. and go ~ 1mile to **Laguna Wastewater Treatment Plant at 4300 Llano Rd, Santa Rosa**. Look for an open gate on right. Saturday, April 11- Field Trip to Pepperwood Preserve

RROS has been invited to the Pepperwood Preserve for a spring field trip. Pepperwood Preserve is a 3117 acre property of The Pepperwood Foundation operated in cooperation with Santa Rosa JC and Sonoma State University. It was established in 1979.

We will expect fabulous wildflowers and land birds. Bring binoculars, scopes, field guides, hats, lunch, water, snacks and sunscreen. For carpooling meet at the Park N' Ride on the west side of HWY 101 at the River Road/MarkWest Exit at 7:30 a.m. Or meet at the preserve at 8a.m. Directions are available on the website or: 3450 Franz Valley Road. From Hwy 101 take River Road/MarkWest exit. Go east on Mark West Road. Continue on Porter Creek road. Turn left onto Franz Valley Road. Preserve will be on the left. Valley temperatures 80's-90's. Sierra temps 60's-70's.

Possible birds: Owen's Lake: Baird's Sandpiper, Sabine's Gull, Snowy Plover, White-faced Ibis, Long-billed Curlew, Peregrine Falcon, Semi-palmated Sandpiper Yellow-headed Blackbird, Great-tailed Grackle, Large numbers of peeps of various species, Bonaparte's Gull, Franklin's Gull, Greater and Lesser Yellowlegs, Dowitchers, LeConte's Thrasher Sierra: Mountain Chickadee, Hairy Woodpecker, Williamson's Sapsucker, Sooty Grouse, Dipper, Brown Creeper, migrating neotropicals (Wood Warblers), Cassin's Finch, Fox Sparrow, Red-breasted Nuthatch, Western Wood-Pewee, Red-breasted Sapsucker, Nighthawks. www.easternsierrabirdingtrail.org


