FIELD TRIP REPORT

Geysers Road, May 8, 2010 - Report from Lisa Hug - leader

Highlights included wonderful views of Lazuli Buntings, a Wild Turkey nest full of tiny nestlings, Western Tanager, Blue-gray Gnatcatcher, Black-throated-Gray Warbler, and Spotted Sandpipers. The weather was very pleasantly warm, with a slight cooling breeze all day. We all just had a fun day. Additional birds to the ones previously mentioned include: - Mallard, Common Merganser, Turkey Vulture, Red-shouldered Hawk, Red-tailed Hawk, American Kestrel, California Quail, Mountain Quail, Mourning Dove, Eurasian Collared Dove, Anna's Hummingbird, Acorn Woodpecker, Nuttall's Woodpecker, Northern Flicker, Pileated Woodpecker, Pacific-slope Flycatcher, Black Phoebe, Ash-throated Flycatcher, Western Kingbird, Violet-green Swallow, Cliff Swallow, Northern Rough-winged Swallow, Steller's Jay, Western Scrub-Jay, American Crow, Common Raven, Oak Titmouse, Bushtit, Bewick's Wren, House Wren, Western Bluebird, American Robin, Wrentit, Northern Mockingbird, Cedar Waxwing, European Starling, Cassin's Vireo, Hutton's Vireo, Warbling Vireo, Orange-crowned Warbler, Wilson's Warbler, Black-headed Grosbeak, Spotted Towhee, California Towhee, Chipping Sparrow, Song Sparrow, Oregon Junco, Western Meadowlark, Brewer's Blackbird, Bullock's Oriole, Purple Finch, House Finch, Lesser Goldfinch.

<u>Vaux's Swifts -</u> Remember to take a sunset trip to Healdsburg to see these birds who visit with us for a short time in September before continuing their fall migration. Rio Linda Seventh Day Adventist Academy graciously permits people to visit in the evenings and watch the birds bed down for the night in the large brick chimney there. It is an amazing sight to watch thousands of birds swirl around and then drop in to roost communally! Take the Healdsburg Avenue exit, traveling on the west side of 101, then turn east on Bailhache Ave. just south of Healdsburg, eventually bearing left on Rio Lindo Avenue until you reach the academy. The chimney is inside the grounds to the left, near the ball fields. There will most likely be others who are there to watch.
