***“New World Wood Warblers”***  
***Presenter: Ian Morrison***

Ian Morrison will present a visual and auditory overview of the 21 species in the Dendroica genus of New World Wood Warblers found in North America. He will play recordings of their songs for us to match with paintings he has done of each of these birds. Plan to join us and gain more understanding about these lovely birds. This brief program will precede a time for member photo sharing so bring your photos, CDs, and memory sticks. Binoculars would also be helpful.

Meet at 7 am at the Hwy 116 and Hwy 121 (south of Sonoma) Park n Ride for car pooling. It will be a full day so bring lunches etc. Heavy rain will cancel.

Napa Sonoma Marshes – Saturday, March 12, 2011

This is an all day field trip designed to explore the varied habitats of the marshlands that border San Pablo Bay in Napa and Sonoma Counties. The first half of the field trip will take place in Napa County. The latter half of the day will be spent in Sonoma County. We will begin our exploration by touring the **SOSCOL WATER RECYCLING FACILITY** on Soscol Ferry Road in Napa. A Plant employee will meet us and travel with us as we bird the ponds. After investigating the water recycling facility, we will travel down to American Canyon Wetlands, located at the corner of Eucalyptus Drive and Wetlands Edge Road. There are expansive tidal marshes here.

After lunch, we will travel the backroads of the region – mostly in Sonoma County. We'll explore Milton, Cuttings Wharf, Duhig, Las Amigas, Buchli Station, and Ramal Roads, checking out all ponds and "good-looking habitat" that we come across. We will be sure to incorporate a nice afternoon hike in the Hudeman Slough Area of the Huichica Creek Unit of the Marshes. The pinnacle of the outing will be a dusk wait at Huichica Creek for the appearance of owls hunting over the agricultural fields. Possibilities include Short-eared, Burrowing, Barn, and Great-horned.

Meet at the Park and Ride in Petaluma (Lakeville St.(Hwy.116)/Hwy: 101) at 7am, or the corner of 8th Street and Highway 12 near Schellville at 7:30am. Bring enough food for a very full day and plenty of water. Dress appropriately (layers). Some folding chairs would make the lunch break more comfortable. Trip leader(s) *to be announced*. Heavy rain cancels.

**Thursday, June 23 - Monday, June 27, 2011** - This will be an incredible trip lead by Bob Barnes, a highly respected professional birding leader in the Kernville area. You must call Pat at 760-376-2535 to reserve one of the RR0S rooms in your name with a credit card. Do not do this on line. Unreserved rooms will be held until June 15<sup>th</sup> then released. There is camping in the area, as well. The trip is limited to 15 people. ***Only 4 spaces left!*** Expect to carpool, no exceptions. Bob charges \$250/ day which covers all of his expenses. ### FIELD TRIP REPORT – Las Gallinas Wastewater Treatment Plant

On January 8<sup>th</sup>, a band of around a dozen birders bundled beyond recognition met at Las Gallinas WTP to be led by Len Blumin and Don Reinberg in the first outing in 2011 for RR0S. It's always nice to join a couple local birders on their patch. Len regaled us with his considerable knowledge of the over 60 species we encountered and Don squired us around in comfort despite the cold.

Results of the 51st Santa Rosa Christmas Bird Count December 19, 2010

46 birders braved the rainy weather and luckily it let up a little in the afternoon. I guess it wouldn't be the SRCBC without rain! We had 129 species observed with 4 more count week birds and a total of 297,845 birds counted! Highlights included: a first cycle Glaucous Gull in Rohnert Park found and photographed by Rick LeBaudour and Richard Merriss, a Burrowing Owl at the old airfield found by Lisa Hug, a Pacific Loon at Spring Lake (originally found by Glo Wellman,) 4 Mountain Quail by Ian Morrison's team, 8 Merlins!, a Black-throated Gray Warbler found by Peter Colasanti at Doyle Park, an Orange-cr Warbler found by Betty Groce's team, 38 Evening Grosbeaks! and 279,533 Starlings most counted by Doug Shaw.

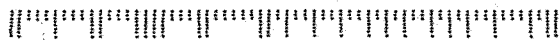

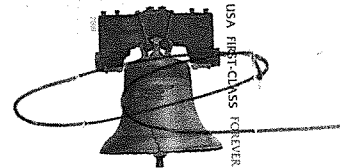
