# RROS General Meeting Thursday, March 10th, 2011 7-9 PM

"Burrowing Owls"
Presenter: Scott Artis

Scott Artis, the Founding Director of the Burrowing Owl Conservation Network, will discuss the decline in Burrowing Owl numbers and the serious threats that they face. He will describe actions being taken to stabilize the population. And he will discuss conservation projects here in Sonoma County involving habitat restoration and artificial burrows. An important goal is to have Burrowing Owls breeding in Sonoma County again.

RROS strongly supports the work of the Burrowing Owl Conservation Network. At the February meeting, members voted to donate \$300 to the Burrowing Owl Conservation Network to further its work here in Sonoma County.

<u>Directions to the meeting:</u> From Hwy 101 take Hwy 116 West toward Sebastopol. Turn right (north) on Llano Rd. and go ~ 1 mile to **Laguna Wastewater Treatment Plant at 4300 Llano Rd, Santa Rosa**. Look for an open gate on right. Proceed to Administration Bldg. at SE corner of the plant. From Hwy. 12, take Llano Rd. south about 3 miles. Plant is on left.

<u>Dinner Before the meeting:</u> Join some of us at 5:30 p.m. at the Star Restaurant, 8501 Gravenstein Hwy, Cotati (west of Hwy 101, at exit for Hwy 116 West).

#### **2011 FIELD TRIPS**

#### Napa Sonoma Marshes - Saturday, March 12, 2011

This is an all day field trip designed to explore the varied habitats of the marshlands that border San Pablo Bay in Napa and Sonoma Counties. The first half of the field trip will take place in Napa County. The latter half of the day will be spent in Sonoma County. We will begin our exploration by touring the **SOSCOL WATER RECYCLING FACILITY** on Soscol Ferry Road in Napa. A Plant employee will meet us and travel with us as we bird the ponds. After investigating the water recycling facility, we will travel down to American Canyon Wetlands, located at the corner of Eucalyptus Drive and Wetlands Edge Road. There are expansive tidal marshes here.

After lunch, we will travel the backroads of the region – mostly in Sonoma County. We'll explore Milton, Cuttings Wharf, Duhig, Las Amigas, Buchli Station, and Ramal Roads, checking out all ponds and "good-looking habitat" that we come across. We will be sure to incorporate a nice afternoon hike in the Hudeman Slough Area of the Huichica Creek Unit of the Marshes. The pinnacle of the outing will be a dusk wait at Huichica Creek for the appearance of owls hunting over the agricultural fields. Possibilities include Short-eared, Burrowing, Barn, and Greathorned.

Meet at the Park and Ride in Petaluma (Lakeville St.(Hwy.116)/Hwy. 101) at 7am, or the corner of 8th Street and Highway 12 near Schellville at 7:30am. Bring enough food for a very full day and plenty of water. Dress appropriately (layers). Some folding chairs would make the lunch break more comfortable. Trip leader(s): Robin Leong will lead the morning portion of the trip in Napa Co. Peter Colasanti will lead the afternoon into evening portion of the trip in Sonoma County. Heavy rain cancels.

#### Ida Clayton Road - Tuesday, March 29, 2011

Meet at the intersection Hwy 128 and Ida Clayton Rd at 7:45 a.m.

We will bird Ida Clayton Rd; end up in Lake County at the top and head back via Butts Canyon Rd to Pope Valley in Napa Co. Looking for early arrivals/migrants and chaparral species. ### Field Trip Report -Lake County, February 12, 2011

The weather was gorgeous and the group left from the River Road substation confident of a great group day in the field. Everyone missed the turn off to Rodman Slough (our first meeting spot) except the Haig's who have a GPS. Several of us had an unplanned tour through the charming towns of Nice and Lucerne. Peter (having a DeLormes) and Michael found us halfway through the day after driving nearly to Winters. Sadly, Ruth, Andy, Elaine and Jim never joined the group but got some great birds.

Darlene Hecomovich, our Lake County guide, led us on a tour of the birding spots of Lake County. Highlights were a Red-naped Sapsucker and Phainopepla found on their CBC.

The ports of call were: Rodman Slough, Esplanade Drive in Lakeport, Highland Springs Road in Kelseyville, for the absent Ferruginous Hawk, Lakeside Community Park in Kelseyville, Diener Drive off Hwy 29, the Lower Lake Farm Pond (Canvasback and Egret), Redbud and Austins Parks in Clearlake, and Borax Lake.
