FIELD TRIPS Planned for 2012

Saturday, March 10, 2012 - King Ridge Road

Meet at the bakery on the south side of Hwy 116 in Duncan's Mills at 8 a.m. This is a great spring trip which should have some nice wildflowers. We'll be on the lookout for all land birds. Possible highlights are American Dipper, Mountain Quail and Sooty Grouse. Bring lunch, snacks, optics, sunscreen, layers, hats. We can carpool from Duncan's Mills. Leader = Lisa Hug. Heavy rain cancels.

Saturday, April 21, 2012 - Mitchell Canyon

Mitchell Canyon is a great spring birding spot on the north flanks of Mt Diablo. Hope for birds include Hammond's Flycatcher, Calliope Hummingbird, Hermit Warbler and Nashville Warbler. The wildflowers and butterflies should be beautiful. Meet 7am Petaluma park'n'ride at Lakeville Hwy and Hwy 101 for carpooling. Or meet 8 am at the Mitchell Canyon Parking Area which is located on Mitchell Canyon Road from Clayton Road northeast of Walnut Creek. Bring binoculars, sunscreen, water, food for lunch, hats. This is a walking field trip, about 3 miles. Leader is Rick LeBaudour, 707-974-0004 or rick@sonoma-customtile.com - Let Rick know if you plan to meet at Mitchell Canyon. Heavy rain cancels.

Saturday, May 12, Pine Flat Road

This is is our last official field trip of the season. Pine Flat Road has wonderful rare wildflowers, great butterflies and terrific birds. All the spring nesting species should be in. Meet 8 a.m. at Pine Flat Road past the Jimtown store, where the road narrows, at the bridge. From Hwy 101 take Dry Creek exit to Healdsburg Av to Alexander Valley Road to Pine Flat Road. Bring optics, field guides, water, lunch, sunscreen, hats. Leader is Richard Merriss. Heavy rain cancels.

Field Trip Report - Wintering Birds of Solano and Yolo Counties February 11, 2012

On crisp winter morning, trip leader Terry Colborn met the RROS group in Dixon. We headed south toward Jepson Prairie, and some excellent roadside birding. At Cook's Lane, we saw our first pair of Loggerhead Shrike; we went on to tally an astonishing 18 shrikes for the day! We also had good views of a beautiful Ferruginous Hawk, while a handsome Prairie Falcon was teed-up on a nearby pole. In the marsh, Terry alerted us to a Virginia Rail as it called from deep within the reeds. Several Wilson's Snipe flushed, showing their familiar zig-zag flight pattern. Along Flannery Road we were treated to a stunning Burrowing Owl as it sunned itself from a rocky outcropping. After lunch we birded the Yolo Basin Wildlife Area. Some of the highlights included numerous species of waterfowl in beautiful late afternoon sunlight, Common Gallinule, a pair of Eared Grebe, and a Great Horned Owl on its roost. A huge flock of House Finch, perhaps 500 strong, appeared as ground cover in a meadow. As the last of the participants drove out of the refuge, a Peregrine Falcon zipped across the roadway. Terry stopped the caravan to point out an American Bittern that was cryptically hiding in plain view!

Department of Fish and Game Day Use Access – researched by Don Howard

The State of California has changed its procedures regarding day use fees for its wildlife areas, including: Gray Lodge, Grizzly Island, Los Banos, San Jacinto, Imperial, Elkhorn Slough and Upper Newport Bay Ecological Reserve. It is no longer possible to purchase a day use pass at the wildlife area. Rather, you must obtain the day use pass through the internet (CA DFG) OR by visiting a DFG facility or a retail agent that sells fishing and hunting licenses. The cost of an annual pass is \$22.68, a one-use day pass \$4.32. It is our understanding that the annual pass covers the calendar year in which it was purchased. RROS may be able to purchase the passes in bulk and have them available to members.

Redwood Region Ornithological Society (www.rros.org) was organized in 1962 "to encourage the study and conservation of birds, other wildlife, and their natural habitat." Meetings are held the second Thursday of each month September through May, at 7:00 pm at the Laguna Waste Water Treatment Plant, 4300 Llano Road, Santa Rosa California, unless otherwise announced.
