FIELD TRIPS Planned for Spring 2012

Saturday, April 21, 2012 - Mitchell Canyon

Mitchell Canyon is a great spring birding spot on the north flanks of Mt Diablo. Hope for birds include Hammond's Flycatcher, Calliope Hummingbird, Hermit Warbler and Nashville Warbler. The wildflowers and butterflies should be beautiful. Meet 7am Petaluma park'n'ride at Lakeville Hwy and Hwy 101 for carpooling. Or meet 8 am at the Mitchell Canyon Parking Area which is located on Mitchell Canyon Road from Clayton Road northeast of Walnut Creek. Bring binoculars, sunscreen, water, food for lunch, hats. This is a walking field trip, about 3 miles. Leader is Rick LeBaudour, 707-974-0004 or rick@sonoma-customtile.com - Let Rick know if you plan to meet at Mitchell Canyon. Heavy rain cancels.

Saturday, May 12, Pine Flat Road

This is our last official field trip of the season. Pine Flat Road has wonderful rare wildflowers, great butterflies and terrific birds. All the spring nesting species should be in. Meet 8 a.m. at Pine Flat Road past the Jimtown store, where the road narrows, at the bridge. From Hwy 101 take Dry Creek exit to Healdsburg Av to Alexander Valley Road to Pine Flat Road. Bring optics, field guides, water, lunch, sunscreen, hats. Leader is Richard Merriss. Heavy rain cancels.

New birds for the Sonoma County List have been seen and documented! ~reported by Ruthie Rudesill

SLATY-BACKED GULL - On December 16, 2011 Gene Hunn had observed and described a 3rd cycle Slaty-backed Gull at the Russian River mouth at Goat Rock Beach. On February 6, 2012 Dan Nelson observed a probable adult Slaty-backed Gull at the Russian River mouth at Goat Rock Beach. On February 20, 2012 Todd Easterla was on Goat Rock Beach and Don Kirker, Helen Kochenderfer and Bill Doyle were across the Russian River at the overlook observed an adult Slaty-backed Gull in the gull flock; Todd confirmed with photos.

PARAKEET AUKLET - which was previously on the county list but was removed after investigation to offshore locations indicated the birds sighted were in neighboring counties. On January 28,2012 Gene Hunn and Peter Colsasanti were on a fishing boat out of Bodega Bay and spotted a Parakeet Auklet flying away from them. GPS indicated that they were 5 miles west of Bodega Head and just in Sonoma County waters!

Note: the 2010 RUSTY BLACKBIRD record is being recirculated in the CRBC. The Sonoma County list is at 439 not including these species.

Years ago we put up a barn owl box in our Sebastopol yard. Barn owls moved right in. They raised owlets every year until 2010 when they did not return. But the box did not stay empty for long. Wood ducks came and nested there.

In 2011 the barn owls were back, but the wood ducks kept coming by and sitting on top of the box. The hen would often lean over the edge and look longingly at the entry. My husband, Gary, felt sorry for the homeless ducks, so he built them a wood duck box. They were delighted, and the hen went right inside to inspect it. But before she moved in, a western screech owl did. Once again she was homeless. But Gary has a very soft heart, so he built another wood duck box - problem solved. Or was it? The screech owl decided to move to the new box, then back and forth from box to box. The poor wood ducks eventually gave up and stopped coming. The peripatetic screech owl finally settled down and raised her owlets in the second duck box.

This year the barn owls and screech owls are back. Luckily we had a vacant box available for the wood ducks. A wood duck moved in and is incubating eggs right now. All's well that ends well.

Field Trip Report - King Ridge Road - March 10, 2012

Our all-day field trip to King Ridge Road and the Jenner Overlook above the River Mouth in the late afternoon was a huge success. The most interesting bird was a TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE picked up by the call by Jeff Miller. We could not locate the bird, but we all agreed on the "rusty gate" call note. This was up about 14 miles from the base of the road above Cazadero. We also saw a fly-over WHITE-THROATED SWIFT and 2 GOLDEN EAGLES. We heard SOOTY GROUSE. We enjoyed seeing large numbers of VARIED THRUSHES at multiple stops. And of course, the wildflowers were wonderful. Our stop at the Russian River Mouth Overlook was spectacular. We had a thrilling raptor display - most of it happening at eye level as we were on a high overlook. We first noticed an immature BALD EAGLE perched in an evergreen tree, but its perch was usurped by a PEREGRINE FALCON. We then watched an OSPREY catch fish below us. We could see it under the water. Above us, two WHITE-TAILED KITES dive-bombed a RED-TAILED HAWK. It was sometimes difficult to know where to look. We also saw a first cycle GLAUCOUS GULL on the beach. It was a wonderful day!

Bird species include: Common Merganser, Common Goldeneye, Surf Scoter, Sooty Grouse, Wild Turkey, California Quail, Red-throated Loon, Pacific Loon, Pied-billed Grebe, Western Grebe, Brandt's Cormorant, Pelagic Cormorant, Double-crested Cormorant, Great Blue Heron, Turkey Vulture, Osprey, White-tailed Kite, Bald Eagle, Northern Harrier, Cooper's Hawk, Red-tailed Hawk, Golden Eagle, American Kestrel, Peregrine Falcon, American Coot, Black Turnstone, Mew Gull, California Gull, Western Gull, Thayer's Gull, Glaucous-winged Gull, Glaucous Gull, Bandtailed Pigeon, White-throated Swift, Anna's Hummingbird, Belted Kingfisher, Acorn Woodpecker, Hairy Woodpecker, Northern Flicker, Pileated Woodpecker, Black Phoebe, Hutton's Vireo, Steller's Jay, Western Scrub-Jay, American Crow, Common Raven, Chestnut-backed Chickadee, Oak Titmouse, Bushtit, White-breasted Nuthatch, Pygmy Nuthatch, Brown Creeper, Pacific Wren, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, Western Bluebird, Townsend's Solitaire, Hermit Thrush, American Robin, Varied Thrush, European Starling, Orange-crowned Warbler, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Townsend's Warbler, Spotted Towhee, California Towhee, White-crowned Sparrow, Goldencrowned Sparrow, Oregon Junco, Red-winged Blackbird, Western Meadowlark, House Finch, Pine Siskin, Lesser Goldfinch, and House Sparrow.


