Tom Reynolds found this beautiful male Indigo Bunting on Pine Flat Road near the mile 3.5 marker. He saw and photographed it twice on July 1 and July 7, 2012. The Indigo Bunting's summer range includes most of the eastern United States, going west into southern Nevada and a thin slice of southeastern California. Vaux Swifts

Every September the Vaux Swifts return to roost at the Rio Lindo Academy in Healdsburg. At dusk, they gather and circle around the huge chimney until they begin to drop down into their nightly roosting site. Sometimes there are so many swifts that it looks like a funnel going into the chimney. You may also spot some opportunistic hawks hunting the swifts. If you are interested in going to watch this phenomenon, the website www.riolindo.org will announce estimates on the number of swifts daily during the peak roosting period. 
