

FIELD TRIPS - February 2013 and beyond:

Saturday, February 9, 2013 - Wintering Raptors and Waterfowl of Solano and Yolo Counties

The open agricultural lands of Solano and Yolo Counties provide excellent foraging habitat for scores of wintering raptors, while the wetlands of the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area are the winter home for thousands of waterfowl including ducks, geese, swans and many shorebirds. This all-day field trip will visit several local winter habitats in search of Ferruginous and Rough-legged hawks; Merlin; Prairie Falcon; Burrowing, Barn and Great-horned Owls; Long-billed Curlew, as well as the elusive and threatened Mountain Plover. We also expect to see a representative sampling of waterfowl and a variety of shorebirds at the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area, aka the Vic Fazio Refuge. Participants meet the leader at 8:00am in Dixon in the southwest corner of the Wal-Mart parking lot, located on East Dorset Drive at the Hwy 113 exit off I-80. Friday, March 9 - Sunday, March 11, 2013 - Carrizo Plain

The Carrizo Plain is an Important Bird Area covering 281 square miles along the San Andreas Fault between the Central Valley and the coast in southeastern San Luis Obispo County. With a giant seasonal alkali lake, low rolling grasslands and arid scrub, it's a really big "microcosm" of the Central Valley as it was before reclamation by agriculture. With over 10% of California's Sandhill Cranes, big country raptors, Mountain Plovers, Short and Longeared Owls, Le Conte's Thrashers, Pronghorns and Tule Elk, there's a lot to see. It's one of the most carefully managed areas in California.

Join the club for the weekend of March 9 and 10. We'll be spending Saturday the 9th in Carrizo Plain itself after rocketing down I-5 on Friday the 8th. Sunday I plan to return nearer the coast via either the Santa Maria River or Atascadero, with perhaps another layover night somewhere en route. Participants are welcome to bird their way home with me or hustle back on I-5.

Saturday, June 8 - Sunday June 9, 2013 - Sierra Owling

Join Gene Hunn in Foresthill, Placer County and environs looking for night birds. We'll bird Mosquito Ridge to French Meadows Reservoir by day, then do it all again after dinner for 6 possible owls, including Flammulated, and Poorwill too. Sunday we'll explore Foresthill divide Road to Robinson Flat and maybe hike up Duncan Peak Lookout.

Contact me if you're interested in joining, there are options for a bed in Foresthill or camping on Mosquito Ridge, I'd like to get a handle on folks' preference. Details in upcoming issues of Kite Tales.

The January outing to the San Mateo Coast was held under mostly cerulean skies with limitless visibility along a truly Pacific Ocean. Richard BB Merris and sidekick Rick led us on a successful chase of recently posted rarities. First was a Long-tailed Duck sharing a tidal rip with scoters off Fort Miley in the Presidio of San Francisco. Next we pulled up to a sapsucker riddled Sweetgum/Liquidambar past Pescadero to await the appearance of a Black-throated Blue Warbler. As we arrived, local birder Mark Kudrov appeared on his bicycle to assist and give the bird's recent history and offer other tips of area sightings. The male BTBW didn't keep us waiting long, providing good views and photo opportunities too. We ate lunch up Stage Road where we swept the Phoebes and added a number of landbirds to our day list. The rest of the trip inluded coastal sites on our northbound return, with a final stop at Pilar Point at Half Moon Bay. In all, 96 species were logged: Red-throated Loon, Pacific Loon, Common Loon, Pied-billed Grebe, Horned Grebe, Eared Grebe, Western Grebe, Clark's Grebe, Brown Pelican, Double-crested Cormorant, Brandt's Cormorant, Pelagic Cormorant, Great Blue Heron, Great Egret, Snowy Egret, Black-crowned Night-Heron, Canada Goose, Brant, Green-winged Teal, Mallard, Northern Pintail, Northern Shoveler, Ring-necked Duck, Greater Scaup, Long-tailed Duck, Surf Scoter, Common Goldeneve, Bufflehead, Red-breasted Merganser, Ruddy Duck, Turkey Vulture, White-tailed Kite, Northern Harrier, Red-shouldered Hawk, Red-tailed Hawk, American Kestrel, Merlin, Peregrine Falcon, American Coot, Black Oystercatcher, Black-bellied Plover, Killdeer, Snowy Plover, Marbled Godwit, Willet, Black Turnstone, Surfbird, Sanderling, Heermann's Gull, Mew Gull, Ring-billed Gull, California Gull, Glaucous-winged Gull, Western Gull, Thayer's Gull, Herring Gull, Rhinoceros Auklet, Rock Pigeon, Eurasian Collared-Dove, Red-masked Parakeet, White-throated Swift, Anna's Hummingbird, Eastern Phoebe, Black Phoebe, Say's Phoebe, Tree Swallow, Golden-crowned Kinglet, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, Marsh Wren, Hermit Thrush, American Robin, Bushtit, Chestnut-backed Chickadee, Pygmy Nuthatch, Steller's Jay, Western Scrub-Jay, American Crow, Common Raven, European Starling, Black-throated Blue Warbler, Yellow-rumped Warbler, Townsend's Warbler, Common Yellowthroat, California Towhee, Song Sparrow, White-crowned Sparrow, Golden-crowned Sparrow, Darkeyed Junco, Red-winged Blackbird, Western Meadowlark, Brewer's Blackbird, Great-tailed Grackle, House Finch, Pine Siskin, Lesser Goldfinch, House Sparrow Participants:

"PISHING with PARMETER"

On September 18, 1999, Rick Lebaudour, Alan Wight, and I set out to do a big day for the PRBO Birdathon. On schedule, as usual, we started with owling on Salmon Creek Road. We then drove up King Ridge Road for more owling, and met the dawn a few miles up, where we turned around. Birding our way back down King Ridge Road, with many stops, we arrived at the mouth of Austin Creek. As always, we checked the pond at Cassini's Ranch, then headed toward Jenner, and the mouth of the Russian River. This was one of our best stops, requiring over half an hour. Next, we checked the ponds at Bridgehaven, before heading down the Sonoma Coast, with stops at Duncan's Landing, Schoolhouse Beach, Salmon Creek overlook and ponds. On to Bodega Bay, for a final look for offshore birds, and then around the harbor to Doran Park. We normally have about 120 species by the time we head inland. We checked Carmody Road pond and the

Petaluma Sewer Ponds, finally ending the day at Shollenberger Park, with 177 species. When I checked, I discovered that this was a new American Birding Association September Big Day record for the United States. I submitted the papers, properly signed, and we hold that record to this day. It was also a Sonoma County Big Day record, although, as Dan Nelson pointed out to me, he, Doug Ellis, and Richard Merriss had seen 176 during a Big Day a year or two earlier. At that time, the Western Grebe had not been split into two species. We were able to count both species, including the "new" Clark's Grebe, by the time we did our count. So, perhaps we share the record with Dan's group, though the rules say that the taxonomy in effect at the time of a Big Day holds sway.

Some highlights from our Big Day include: Sooty Shearwater, American Bittern, Redhead, Merlin, Blue Grouse (now Sooty Grouse), American Golden Plover, Pectoral Sandpiper, Wilson's Phalarope, Marbled Godwit, spotted Owl, Saw-whet Owl, Rufous-crowned Sparrow, and Tri-colored Blackbird. *Mike*~


