Birder and artist Keith Hansen set out to see as many species of birds as he could in one calendar year. What sets his quest apart is that he did all his birding on foot, by bicycle, by kayak and other carbon free means of travel. He will show us a video and tell us about this experience. He will also bring some of the artwork for his soon to be published book, "Birds of the Sierra Nevada, Their Natural History, Status and Distribution." Keith has been working on the 1400 individual images in the book for 15 years. His illustrations combine meticulously accurate depictions of the bird with beautiful artistic composition.

Saturday, April 13, 2013 - King Ridge Road

Why not take a break from your taxes and join us on one of the quietest country roads in Sonoma County? We'll ride the ridge for Lark Sparrows and Golden Eagles and stop to listen for booming Sooty Grouse and early Neotropical migrants. Meet at the Petaluma Park n' Ride at Lakeville x SR 101 at 6:30 AM, or the coffee shop at Duncan's Mills at 7:30. Bring your lunch or prepare for some mighty lean foraging opportunities. Oh, and bring a good pair of ears to help the hearing impaired leader, Peter.

Saturday, May 11, 2013 - Mines Road

Tell Mom you'll see her Sunday, but Saturday you'll be birding Mines Road. It runs south from Livermore along the eastern edge of Alameda County and can yield such surprises as Greater Roadrunner. Saturday, June 8 - Sunday June 9, 2013 - Sierra Owling

Join Gene Hunn in Foresthill, Placer County and environs looking for night birds. We'll bird Mosquito Ridge to French Meadows Reservoir by day, then do it all again after dinner for 6 possible owls, including Flammulated, and Poorwill too. Sunday we'll explore Foresthill divide Road to Robinson Flat and maybe hike up Duncan Peak Lookout.

Late Winter at Carrizo Plain

Our trip to Carrizo Plain felt more like late winter than early spring as a passing front gave the area's clay a soaking the day before. After filling our wheel wells with it at Quail Springs Road Saturday morning, we restricted our explorations to gravel roads. We managed to find some quality, despite the low numbers of birds due, no doubt, to the dry winter past. A dozen Mountain Bluebirds early on looked splendid juxtaposed against the gray sky. At Panorama Road, Terry and I went 4 wheeling to the terminal bog in search of Mountain Plovers, but to no avail. While we were gone, Gene Hunn found a solo bird for the group. There were plenty of Ferruginous Hawks seen, including one dark morph kind enough to fly by a light morph for comparison. Prairie Falcon, Curlews, Sage Sparrows and one flock of many hundreds of Horned Larks were also seen by the core group. Additionally, Ruth reported Rough-legged Hawk, Lawrence's Goldfinch and a Sage Thrasher.

The next two days were spent birding from Taft to Cayucos on the SLO County coast. After breakfast, many of the group stopped at Petroleum Club Road for killer looks at LeConte's Thrasher. Later Craig found us a pair of Phainopeplas high in Kern on Route 58. We had a Cassin's Kingbird at Laguna Lake Park on Sunday and Great-tailed Grackles there Monday

morning. At Morro Strand we finished up with a flock of Semipalmated Plovers and 39 Snowy Plovers. My own records show 115 species seen over the three days.
