FIELD TRIPS - September 2013 and beyond:

Mid-October, 2013, on a Monday: Check out San Francisco's hot spots for migrants, vagrant or otherwise, plus shore points for shore and seabirds; refine your San Francisco County list. Led by local experts. Meet at Petaluma Fairgrounds parking lot, at 8:00am for carpools, or at 9 or so (depending on traffic) in San Francisco at Fort Mason Conservancy Headquarters in Bldg. 201. October 27, 2013, Sunday: Tolay Lake Regional Park. Meet to carpool at the boat launch lot just south of Papas at 8 AM. Proceed up Cannon Lane to the gate. Parking in the park requires annual pass or \$7 fee. We will hike about 5 miles on mostly level trails to sample the varied habitats of this Regional Park in the making. Lots of raptors and sparrows in and over the grasslands; some nice ponds with possible American Bittern; oak woodland residents; Barn Owls in the barn; possible wintering Burrowing Owl. Gene Hunn (enhunn323@comcast.net, 981-7301) leads. There is a workshop scheduled for the afternoon at which you can each get your own weekend pass. Bring lunch and water. Heavy rains cancel.

November 19, 2013, Tuesday: Field Trip to the Pope Valley area of Napa County. Meet at 8 AM at the corner of Hwy 128 and Silverado Trail, Napa Valley. We will bird the south end of Lake Hennessey (bathroom stop at boat launch) and then travel to Pope Valley. Bird the Cedar Roughs Wildlife Area and local farm ponds. Then to the north end of Lake Berryessa for lunch. In early afternoon, hit Knoxville Rd for possible Lewis's Woodpeckers. Other possibles: Hooded Merganser, waterfowl and grebes, Bald Eagles and otters. Bring lunch and money for parking. Heavy rain cancels. Leader: Ruth Rudesill, 707-833-6026 or ruthier@sonic.net.

November 23, 2013, Saturday: Gulls of the Sonoma County coast. Meet at Bodega Bay at the large dirt lot along Westshore Rd. at Bay Flat Rd. Check Bodega Bay, Salmon Creek beach, and Goat Rock Beach (and points between) for roosting flocks of gulls. The usual suspects include (of all ages): Heermann's, Mew, Ring-billed, Western, California, Herring, Thayer's, Glaucous-winged, and maybe Bonaparte's, with the slim possibility of rarities such as Glaucous, Black-legged Kittiwake, Iceland, and/or Slaty-backed (but don't hold your breath), plus hybrids (aarrrgh!). There will be lots of non-gulls to look at also. Gene Hunn leads (enhunn323@comcast.net, 981-7301). Bring lunch or forage en route. Heavy rains cancel.

FIELD TRIP REPORT:

September 1st, PelagicWe motored from seas mild to almost glassy on the second annual RROS Pelagic trip Sunday September 1. The birds made a good showing; we had a nice variety, though numbers of shearwaters were relatively low for the season. No great rarities were seen, but a couple of superlative experiences were had, including a mixed flock of Storm-petrels that most participants estimated at around 400 individuals. At another point in the trip Captain Rick cut the engine within a quite reasonable distance from a pod of feeding Humpback Whales which then came to check us out (or the bait below the hull) surrounding the boat and rising to blow within as close as 25 feet from us. You could almost smell their breath.

September 18th, Rodeo Lagoon and Hawk Hill- This lightly attended trip began at Rodeo Lagoon, with the leaders, Gene Hunn and Don Reinberg, accompanied by participants Helen Kochenderfer and Bill Doyle. On one of the most beautiful mornings so far this fall, most of the expected birds were seen, but no rarities. When thermal time arrived, the party repaired to Hawk Hill, where Elaine Pruett, Peter Colasanti, and Don Howard were waiting. There was plenty of action, with a constant parade of Red-tailed, Red-shouldered, Cooper's, and Sharp-shinned Hawks, Turkey Vultures, and other soaring birds. What must have been a first-of-season Ferruginous Hawk materialized seemingly out of thin air, made a pass in front of the group, and continued across the Golden Gate. A much-anticipated Broad-winged Hawk was called, but at such a great distance that no details could be seen. Finally, a short time later, a beautiful Broad-winged flew in on a bee line for the hill, and made a couple of slow passes right over our heads...very satisfying, and a CA lifer for at least one of the group.

"PISHING with PARMETER"

Lewis's Woodpecker- Seeing a Lewis's Woodpecker is always a treat. Usually seen in small groups of 4 or 5, it flies with a flat flight, appearing all dark like a crow, rather than showing the pretty strawberry color of its belly. On 11/12/61 Gordon Bolander and I were birding on Annapolis Road in NW Sonoma County. We stopped near the crest of the hill about a mile west of the town of Annapolis and, to our surprise, when we got out of the car, we were surrounded by a large flock of this species. The birds were often giving their low pitched peculiar calls. We spent some time in determining the number of individuals. We came up to a count of approximately 200 Lewis's. They were doing some flycatching on the wing as they moved about, gradually moving south. This species is noted to migrate in large flocks in the fall while locating a winter site. I was thrilled to see this mélange of birds. I have not seen a similar flock of migratory Lewis's since then. In January, a few years ago, there was an estimated group of 150 birds in the oak woodland at the north end of Lake Berryessa. These were obviously wintering birds. The Birder's Handbook notes this is the only species of woodpecker that will perch on a wire. The bird has recently been moved into the genus Melanerpes, along with the Acorn Woodpecker. It was previously in a monotypic genus, Asyndesmus, which refers to a peculiar suture in the bird's skull, the only woodpecker to have this feature. Mike~
