RROS General Meeting, First United Methodist Church 1551 Montgomery Ave., Santa Rosa, CA January 13, 2016, 7:00 pm Monthly Meeting, January 13, 2016: Dr. Tessa Hill. Ocean acidification on the California coast: Impacts on native species and ecosystems- Increasing atmospheric carbon dioxide concentrations have fundamentally changed the chemistry of the ocean, making it more acidic. This chemical change impacts many of the organisms living in the ocean. This talk will review the ongoing research at UC Davis Bodega Marine Lab that focuses on understanding the impacts of ocean acidification on our local environment, including a partnership with the Hog Island Oyster Company to investigate impacts on sustainable seafood.

Save the date: February 10, 2016- Larry Broderick, of West County Hawkwatch, will share his knowledge of local raptors. He will give instruction on raptor identification. He will also discuss where and when to find raptors in our area.

DINNER BEFORE MEETING: Join us at 5:30 p.m., at **Mary's Pizza Shack**, 535 Summerfield Rd., Santa Rosa, across from Howarth Park. From Hwy. 101 take Hwy. 12 east. Turn left on Farmer's Ln., right on Montgomery Dr. and right on Summerfield Rd. Mary's will be on your right. They do not accept reservations for groups smaller than 15, so when you arrive just ask to be seated with the RROS birders' group in the back room.

<u>FIELD TRIPS – January 9, 2016, Saturday:</u> Gulls of the Sonoma County coast. Meet in Bodega Bay, at the horse trailer parking lot along Bay Flat Rd., at 8:30 am. We will check Bodega Bay, Bodega Head, Salmon Creek beach, and Goat Rock Beach (and points between) for roosting flocks of gulls (and other birds of interest). The usual suspects include (of all ages): Heermann's, Mew, Ring-billed, Western, California, Herring, Thayer's, Glaucous-winged, and maybe Bonaparte's, with the slim possibility of rarities such as Glaucous, Black-legged Kittiwake, Iceland, and/or Slaty-backed (but don't hold your breath), plus hybrids (aarrrgh!). There will be lots of non-gulls to look at also. Gene Hunn leads (enhunn323@comcast.net, 707-981-7301). Bring lunch, or forage en route. Heavy rains cancel.

January 22, 2016, Friday: Photography Workshop, Rick LeBaudour, Leader (sct-rick@vom.com)- Meet at the horse trailer parking lot along Bay Flat Rd., in Bodega Bay, at 8:30 am. Bring camera gear. Heavy rain cancels.

February 13, 2016, Saturday: Wintering Raptors and Waterfowl of the Central Valley: (Leader TBA), 8:00am - 4:00pm. The open agricultural lands of the Central Valley provide excellent foraging habitat for scores of wintering raptors, while the wetlands of the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area are the winter home for thousands of waterfowl, including ducks, geese, swans and many shorebirds. This all-day field trip will visit several local habitats in search of wintering raptors. With some luck we may encounter a Ferruginous or Rough-legged Hawk. The uncommon Prairie Falcon and Merlin are also possibilities. We expect to see a representative sampling of the wintering waterfowl, and a variety of shorebirds at the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area. If there is interest, and time permits, we could make the drive to Solano County in search of the elusive Mt. Plover, whose numbers have been in steady decline for the past decade. Meet at 8:00 am in south Davis, at the Nugget Center parking lot, behind Burger King (403 Mace Blvd, Davis), on the corner on Mace and Chiles Road. Bring a lunch/snacks and liquids; dress in layers. This is a good outing for both beginners and experienced birders alike. Heavy rain cancels.



Stalwart counters got the job done, and some even claimed to have had a "great time". The compilation dinner was held at Adel's Restaurant, on Mendocino Ave. Attendance was light, with a crowd about half normal size, probably due to participants' lack of interest in going back out into the continuing rain. Many thanks to those who did attend, and to all who took part. The final species tally, 130, was lower than average, and certainly due to the weather. We need all the rain we can get, and a good winter will encourage an equally good bird season to follow. We'll hope for fine weather next year!

Pishing with Parmeter~ OFFSHORE TRIP

RROS held its 24th offshore trip on 5/9/76. This trip was to the Cordell Banks. Our very early trips were just straight off the Sonoma coast, but, once having discovered the Banks, almost all subsequent trips visited this very productive birding spot. The boat was George Sumner's fishing boat, the Finback. It was a bit slow, about 7-8 knots/hour. A trip to the Banks took 3 hours, then a couple of hours at or near the birds, then return to port. While the boat was slow, it provided an excellent and stable base for birding. The cost was \$10 per person, and the boat could accommodate 15 birders. Gordon Bolander was the leader. Dr. John Arnold and myself were also aboard. Sorry I don't recall the others.

Birds seen included: Black-footed Albatross 26+, Fulmar 30+, Pink-footed Shearwater 10, Sooty Shearwater 18, Fork-tailed Storm Petrel 30+, Leach's Storm Petrel 4, and Ashy Storm Petrel 20+. Red Phalaropes were recorded along with a few Northern Phalaropes. Both Pomarine and Parasitic Jaegers were present. Black-legged Kittiwake 9, Sabine's Gull 18, Arctic Tern 15+, Common Murre 150, Pigeon Guillemot 16, Cassin's Auklet 11, Rhinoceros Auklet 15, and Tufted Puffin 1.

I don't recall water conditions or the incidence of seasickness. A good productive trip, enjoyed by all.
