

#### TO "JOIN" THE ZOOM MEETING

The meeting is open to both RROS members and non-members. A non-member MUST contact Anne O'Donnell (auodonnell@gmail.com) to "register" their email contact info for the meeting (will be used ONLY for the purpose of verifying a friendly person).
- 2) Follow the prompts to download and run ZOOM and/or to ensure that you have the current version of the ZOOM app.
- 3) Enter the meeting ID NUMBER\*, if prompted. Enter the PASSCODE\*, if prompted.
- 4) Click to "join the audio conference". Once in the meeting, you may click on the "START VIDEO" or "JOIN VIDEO" button to Zoom yourself into the conference.
- 5) Once the presentation starts, please select the "mute" button to block audio from your station. At any time during and/ or at the conclusion of the presentation, click on the "CHAT" button at the bottom of the screen to type in any comments or questions.

#### **Trouble Shooting:**

If the presenter and slides are blocked by the "windows" of other participants, click on "hide video panel", on the TOP RIGHT of your screen.

If you find that you've reached the "waiting room" and can't get into the meeting, or if you've been dropped from the meeting, PLEASE contact Rob O'Donnell, identify yourself and we'll try to make sure you can join.

# Field Trip Reports

#### Huichica Creek // February 27, 2021

On February 27, Lucas Stephenson, one of the stars of the YAMS, expertly led twelve birders on a trip to Huichica Creek in Napa County. The weather was beautiful, duck-hunting season was over, and a wonderful day was had by all. Highlights were a huge raft of about 500 Eared Grebe, a flock of about 200 Greater White-fronted Geese, a female Blue-winged Teal, and an early Cliff Swallow. These were in addition to Dunlin, Semi-palmated Plovers and other shore birds, Virginia Rail and Sora. A total of sixty-five species were seen. Lucas promises this spot will only get more birdy in March as the Spring migration gets into full tilt. #### Owling at Salmon Creek Road // March 13, 2021

Ten birders joined **Ruthie Rudesill** for an evening of owling at Salmon Creek Road at Fitzpatrick Lane. It was a windy, clear, cold evening and no moonlight. Sadly, it was pretty quiet - with short answers from **Western Screech-owl** and

Northern Pygmy-owl. We heard a far away Northern Saw-whet Owl and most exciting was near-by bill clacking, but we could not locate the bird. We believe it was a Saw-whet too. Heard mysterious noises that Bob H recorded but sounded more mammal-like but unknown. Great star gazing and company.



# PISHING with PARMETER

COLOMBIA (AMAZON BASIN) : JULY 16, 1975

On 16 July 1975 we set out from Monkey Island and sailed up the Kiuru River, a small tributary of the Amazon. There were ten of us in three canoes.

In a dugout the front person does the paddling and directs the position of the boat. I always paddled; this allowed me to see the birds in the heavy stream-side growth.

We immediately started ticking lifers. Slender-billed Kite was the first, and the second was Large-billed Tern. The latter species occurs all over the Amazon drainage in South America, and there are three or four vagrant records in the US. Other birds included Ringed Kingfisher, Tropical Kingbird, Pale-vented Pigeon, Festive Parrot, Russet-backed Oropendola (like a huge oriole), Great Egret, Greater Ani, Black-capped Mockingthrush (now Black-capped Donacobius), Yellow-hooded Blackbird, and Yellow-billed Tern. This last species is widespread in the Amazon Basin and resembles a Least Tern, whereas Large-billed Tern is much larger and reminds one of a skimmer:

At some point we landed on a sandy beach and went up a hill to an Indian village. The Indians sold us some souvenirs, some decorated with bird feathers, and were no doubt glad to get some cash. However, the village stank so badly that I went back to the beach and waited for the group.

Other birds observed during the day included Chestnut-fronted Macaw, Brown-chested Martin, Capped Heron, Black-tailed Tityra, Striated Heron (very similar to our Green Heron), Pied Lapwing, Amazonian Umbrellabird (an impressive animal!), Chestnut Jacamar, Yellow-tufted Woodpecker, Yellow-rumped Cacique (like an oriole), Chestnut-eared Aracari (a toucan), Bare-necked Fruitcrow, Scarlet-crowned Barbet, White-bellied Parrot, Paradise tanager (a strikingly beautiful bird), Black Caracara, Band-tailed Oropendola, and Masked Crimson Tanager.

Some other species that were new for the trip were Blueand-gold Macaw, Crested Oropendola, Lettered Aracari, Red-and-green Macaw, Cinnamon Attila, Buff-throated Woodcreeper, and Lesser Kiskadee.

My day list included 32 life birds. One of the last, and one of the most spectacular, was a **Solitary Eagle**.
