## YAMS Participate in the Santa Rosa Christmas Bird Count

Our team assembled in the morning in the old Santa Rosa Water Treatment Plant on Stony Point Road. We are now an assemblage of both veteran and young birders. This combination works well. We have learned to combine the sharp senses of youth with the wisdom that comes with experience. Every team member has a vital role.

As anyone who participated in the Count knows, it was a very wet, rainy, day. But, we persisted through

the afternoon even after our clothes were drenched to our skin. Our three YAM participants were Gabe Tarantino, Beatrice Pezzolo, and Clayton Rucker.

It didn't take me long to discover that Clayton had extraordinary eyesight. I adopted the strategy of following a few feet behind him and letting him spot

the birds. After he was able to point out the camouflaged sparrows and pipits to me in the dim light, we would work out their identities together.

Later, we moved on to "A Place to Play" Park on West Third Street. We had a quick gull lesson on one of the playing fields as a flock of about 50 Mew Gulls was mixed in with a few Ring-billed Gulls. We admired the Robins and Cedar Waxwings in the trees near the field and then proceeded to walk around the pond at the west end of the park.

This stroll around the pond was actually not that pleasant in the rain with the wind in our faces for the first half of the walk. But, conditions improved as we rounded the bend at the south end of the pond and returned to our cars. Even though our binoculars were wet and foggy and the light was

dim, Beatrice was able to spot a **Green Heron** for us. It was sitting very still and blending in very nicely with the blurry gray background.

Gabe played a critical part by joining Scott Sorby and the two of them would break off and search for things that we were missing. They ended up seeing our only **Merlin**. A great bird!

All in all, we ended up recording 65 species. In addition to the birds already mentioned, highlights included a Spotted Sandpiper, Wilson's Snipe, and a couple Western and Glaucouswinged Gulls.

Aside from the YAMS, other team members were Denise

Cadman, Marcia Johnson, Brandy Rucker, Scott Sorby, and Christin Lopez.



Our next field trip is Sunday January 13 at Bodega Bay. We will meet at Port o Bodega at 8:30am. This is a half day field trip.

We will also meet on January 23 at Cloverdale River Park to make up for the field trip we missed during the smoky air disaster. This is a half-day field trip.
